THE REAL JESUS The account of events in today's Gospel passage has a strong flavour of realism about it. We can imagine members of his family wanting to take charge of someone they think has lost touch with reality and is exposing himself to public scrutiny. He is running the risk of incurring the wrath of public officials and that can't be a good thing. And what will the neighbours be saying after he leaves? These events also give us an insight into what kind of person Jesus was, his radical approach to things and what appears to be his bluntness. Because you and I identify ourselves with what Jesus taught, we naturally want to know more about the real Jesus who did the teaching.

How much of the real Jesus can we find in the Gospels? After all, the evangelists had a purpose in mind and it wasn't to give us the character of Jesus as if they were writing a biography. They were expressing their faith in Jesus as God's Son and trying to share that with us. We do get an almost shocking glimpse of the reality of Jesus' life in today's Gospel. At this moment, they thought that he might be a bit crazy, an exaggeration perhaps, but at least eccentric to the point of being a danger to himself. The thing that amazed those who knew him and heard him was how he spoke with authority. This did not refer to the manner in which he said things. While the statements were authoritarian in tone, what he said made such eminent sense and was so obviously right, that it was the ideas themselves that possessed the authority and not so much Jesus and his credentials. Bear in mind that the writers of these Gospels knew the end of the story. They had experienced his crucifixion, resurrection and ascension, the Pentecost and seen how rapidly the early Church began to spread. Many of the things they tell us were coloured by that Knowledge. But through it all, if we read between the lines, the real Jesus comes through with his humanity as well as his divinity. In this passage he portrays himself as considering you and me to be his mother, brother or sister. There is little that could make him more attractive to us than that.

<u>CAN YOU KNIT A TEDDY?</u> Dorset Police is calling on the support of knitting enthusiasts across the county to create teddy bears for children in distress. The teddies will be carried in patrol cars and used to comfort young children who are distressed or experiencing a traumatic event. Police Constable Conroy, of Dorset Police, said: "Sadly we regularly attend incidents where children are really having a tough time – it could be a family

argument or a loved one going missing. "We do our best to build relationships with young people at incidents, but something like a teddy bear can be really useful in distracting them from what is going on around them....so the concept of 'Bobby Buddies' was born. "I hope that this initiative will enable us to work closely with the volunteers who knit the buddies. Our aim is to encourage positive interaction with young people, assisting them at difficult times, or just helping them realise that police officers are there to help them and are approachable, and not people to be scared of. "It also shows in this small gesture that so much of the work we do cannot be done without the assistance of our community. Providing the name of the person who knitted the buddy, along with the officer who gifted it, will hopefully show that working together we can make real positive changes."
