LOCKDOWN MESSAGE FROM Fr. TONY

In this present "Lockdown" do you sometimes feel somewhat **imprisoned**? Especially those of you, who like myself are regarded as especially vulnerable, because of age or health conditions. This made me think of Dr Sheila Cassidy, who writes in her book, "*Audacity To Believe*" about her imprisonment in Chile during the wave of violent repression that followed the Pinochet military coup in the early 1970's. She wrote that her first instinct was to scream out to God for help, "to batter spiritually on the bars of my cage, begging to be released." Then a curious idea came to her. Perhaps it was better "to hold out my empty hands to God, not in supplication but in offering. I would say, not 'Please let me out' but, **'Here I am Lord, take me. I trust you. Do with me what you will. . . .'** In my powerlessness and captivity there remained to me one freedom: I could abandon myself into the hands of God." The effect of this prayer was not an instant transformation in her attitude but a gradual process in which she found the necessary courage and strength to meet the occasion. 
for them, will guide and protect them.

PENTECOST PREPARATION 1:

THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE LIFE OF JESUS



In the Gospels Jesus and the Holy Spirit are inseparable, from the moment of his existence to his Ascension into Heaven. Jesus becomes incarnate through the action of the Holy Spirit: "The angel said to Mary: The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you". And Jesus was conceived in Mary's womb. When Jesus began his public life and was baptized in the Jordan by John, something dramatic happened. The heavens opened, the Spirit came upon him and a voice said: "You are my beloved Son. I delight in you". Then, Jesus, was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where he clarified his mission and his identity.

In the power of the Spirit, we are told, Jesus returned to Nazareth, where he went into the synagogue to join the people gathered for worship. After reading to them from the prophet Isaiah, Jesus announced: “The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to preach good tidings to the poor”. From then on, everyone saw and heard the outpouring of that Spirit as Jesus preached, healed and raised the dead. He also delegated that power to the disciples and sent them off to preach and heal too. When they returned full of excitement to tell Jesus all about it, the gospel says that Jesus “jumped for joy in the Holy Spirit”, as he shared their delight. Finally, in the power of the Spirit Jesus went to his passion. Then, the risen Christ, before ascending into heaven, ensured that his followers would be able to continue his mission, so he breathed upon them saying “Receive the Holy Spirit”... to be continued.


