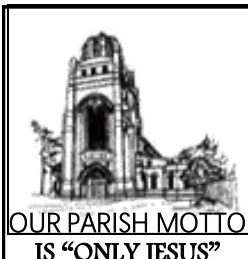

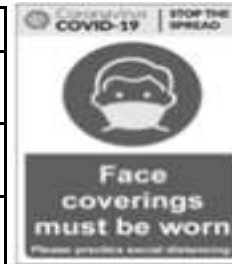

NEWSLETTER 5th Sunday of EASTER Year B **3rd May 2021**

"The readings of the Fifth Sunday of Easter remind us that there is no such thing as a solitary Christian. Every Christian is linked to Christ and to all other Christians. This is clear from the words of Jesus "I am the vine and you are the branches"

Today's readings. First reading (Acts 9: 26-31) This tells us about some of the trials St Paul endured after his conversion. Second reading (1John 3: 18-24) St John is reflecting upon Christ's commandment of love.

Gospel (John 15: 1-8) Jesus uses the image of the vine and its branches to illustrate how close are the ties that bind him to his disciples.

Many today ask "Why should I go to Church?" Why can't I just worship God in my own way? Surely religion is about my personal relationship with God?"

Of course we, all of us, are trying to form a personal relationship with God but from the earliest times, following Jesus was never a private personal matter. Christians came together to live in community, to profess their faith in Jesus Christ, to witness his Resurrection. The profound reason for this is given by Christ himself when he said "I am the vine, you are the branches" The first disciples of Jesus had seen him, eaten with him, and spoken to him after his Resurrection. They had deep connections with him and drew strength from that. He sent them out to share the Good News, to bear much fruit. The Church has attempted to do that over the centuries.

I know my faith in Christ is strengthened by the dedication and love and ministry I witness in Boscombe. We are all living Branches of the Vine." **Thank you all. Keep safe. Fr Adrian**

FEAST OF THE ENGLISH MARTYRS, 4TH MAY. On this day in 1535 there died at Tyburn three Carthusian monks, the first of many English men and women martyred for the Catholic faith during the Reformation. Of these martyrs, 284 have been canonised or declared blessed, but the number of those who died or suffered harsh persecution between 1535 and 1680 cannot now be reckoned. They came from every walk of life and are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in the faith and courage in the face of persecution. Here is the prayer to say, the Collect of the Mass for the day: **Almighty God, who in our country raised up martyrs from every walk of life to vindicate the authority of your Church in teaching and worship, grant through their intercession, we pray, that all our people may be gathered once again to celebrate the same sacraments under the one Shepherd, Jesus Christ, your Son. Who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.**



NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER FOR VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS OF ABUSE will be on its new date of **Tuesday 4th May 2021**. Here at **Corpus Christi Parish** there will be an extra mass in the evening **Mass at 7.00pm** followed by **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament until 8.00pm**. Tuesday also remains the Feast Day of the English Martyrs.

The Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors (PCPM) has highlighted the importance of prayer and suggested to Pope Francis that the worldwide Catholic Church should join together in a day of prayer. The Holy Father has welcomed this initiative. From 2021, in response to a request from the Let's Be Honest working group, the Bishops have chosen Tuesday of the 5th Week of Easter as the Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse — 4th May 2021.

ROSARY MISSION Mgr. Philip Moger, the new Director of the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham, wishes to invite us all to join in a Rosary Mission across the month of May. The intention is to pray for the following:

1. Protecting our families and the family of nations, especially in this Year of St Joseph
2. A deepening of faith, hope and love and the protection of life
3. Peace in the world
4. Deliverance from Coronavirus; for those working for a cure; for those who have died; for those who are suffering and those who care for them.

1. Monday May 24th – Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church - a Rosary Day of Prayer to pray for our young people and for Families.
2. Sunday May 30th – Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - National Rosary Relay Rally throughout the Dioceses of England, Wales and Scotland. Rosary hour in Portsmouth Cathedral is from 12 noon til 1 pm.
3. Monday May 31st – Feast of the Visitation – Bishop John Keenan will host a Crowning Rosary online at 8pm, in thanksgiving for the graces received from the Lord Jesus through the powerful intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary during the May 2021 Rosary Mission.
