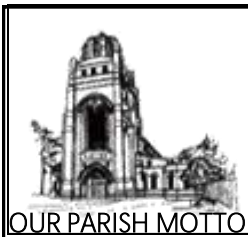

NEWSLETTER 12th SUNDAY of Year B 20th June 2021

"When the Apostles are caught in a storm they turned to Jesus for help. From time to time we get caught in "storms". These storms usually take the form of trials of one kind or another. When this happens we need to turn to the Lord and trust that the Lord will see us through the storm.

First reading of the today. (Job 38: 1, 8-11) God alone has mastery over the sea

Second reading (2 Cor 3: 14-17) Christ showed his great love for us by dying for us. We are asked to respond to his love and imitate his love for us.

Gospel (Mark 4: 35-41) By calming the sea Jesus shows his divine power and care for his disciples.

For the early Christians the calming of the sea was a very relevant miracle. The boat represented the Church and the storm the persecution unleashed on it by evil powers that seem to want to wreck it. They were filled with fear. To them it sometimes seemed that Jesus was asleep. But then they rose to the challenge. It was enough for them to "awaken" him with their prayers, to have trust and faith in his presence, for the storm of their fears to be allayed.

Even though Jesus was with the Apostles in that boat, the storm still struck. So just because a storm strikes us, it does not mean that God has abandoned us. If we have faith, we will not doubt that he is with us. We do not always need to be in control.

The French sailors prayer is apposite "Oh God, thy sea is so great and my boat is so small" God Bless.

ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA (D. 1591) On 21st June 2021, we commemorate St. Aloysius Gonzaga, a **patron saint of youth and Jesuit novices**. Saint Aloysius came from a noble family in Lombardy and was born in 1568. As a young child, he developed a deep and precocious piety, with great devotion and self-discipline. At the age of 11, his father sent him to Florence to further his education. There he often had to appear at the Medici court, but was repulsed by the corruption and hedonism he found himself surrounded by. In 1581 on a visit to Spain, he determined to become a Jesuit missionary, much to the disappointment of his family and in 1584 enrolled in the Jesuit house in Rome. He was sent for studies to Milan, but there he had a vision of his approaching death and suffering from ill-health was transferred back to Rome. In 1587 he took his vows and spent much of his time and energy visiting the sick and caring for victims of the plague. In 1591, he caught the plague himself and died on the 21st June, aged just 23. He received the last rites from his friend and director St. Robert Bellamine.

Here is a prayer he wrote to the Blessed Virgin Mary:

O holy Mary, my Mistress,
into your blessed trust and special keeping, into the bosom of your tender mercy,
this day, every day of my life and at the hour of my death, I commend my soul and my body;
to you I entrust all my hopes and consolations, all my trials and miseries,
my life and the end of my life, that through your most holy intercession and your merits,
all my actions may be ordered and disposed according to your will and that of your Divine Son. Amen
