### 7th Sunday of Ordinary Time Year C - 20th February 2022

"THE VALUES OF THE KINGDOM Jesus says "Be Compassionate .... Do not Judge ... Do not condemn.... Treat others as you would like them to treat you" These words are taken from todays Gospel. Jesus puts before us a way of behaving.

First Reading (1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23) David turns down an opportunity to kill Saul because he believes it would be right before God.


Second Reading (1 Corinthians 15:45-49 ) St Paul draws parallels between Adam and Christ. To Adam we have the life of earth, to Christ the life of Heaven.

Gospel (Luke 6:27-38) Jesus stresses the duty of loving ones enemy and the obligations of fraternal charity.

Jesus challenges us to respond to the darkness with light. To respond to what is in the other with what is best in us. The most important issue today is how to resist evil without doing further evil in the process. Most of us think that we have done our Christian duty if we refrain from doing harm to our enemy. But Jesus asks more of us. He asks us to love our enemies. The readings today challenge us but they above all remind us of God's love for us and how we should respond in love.

THE CHAIR OF ST PETER 22nd February 2022 The physical Chair of Saint Peter, is a relic conserved in St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, Rome. The relic is a wooden throne that belonged to the Apostle Saint Peter, the leader of the Early Christians in Rome and the first Pope, and which he used as Bishop of Rome. But the feast reminds us of the mission of teacher and pastor conferred by Christ on Peter, and continued in an unbroken line down to the present Pope, Pope Francis.

Pope Benedict XVI said of this Chair, (see picture) 'We see that it is characterised by a twofold movement: ascending and descending. This is the reciprocity between faith and love. The Chair is placed in a prominent position in this place (St Peter's Basilica, Rome), because this is where Saint Peter's tomb is locat-

ed, but this too tends towards the love of God. Indeed, faith is oriented towards love. A selfish faith would be an unreal faith. Whoever believes in Jesus Christ and enters into the dynamic of love that finds its source in the Eucharist, discovers true joy and becomes capable in turn of living according to the logic this gift. True faith is illumined by love and leads towards love, leads on high, just as the altar of the Chair points upwards towards the luminous window, the glory of the Holy Spirit, which constitutes the true focus for the pilgrim's gaze as he crosses the threshold of the Vatican Basilica. That window is given great prominence by the triumphant angels and the great golden rays, with a sense of overflowing fullness that expresses the richness of communion with God. God is not isolation, but glorious and joyful love, spreading outwards and radiant with light'. May we truly encounter the depths of faith and love.
