ADVENT WREATH The Advent wreath adorns many of our churches and homes every year. We see it there, and the lighted candles increasing week by week, but we might not realise its symbolism., so here is a bit about its history and beautiful symbolism for each week of Advent as we wait for Christmas to arrive.. The Advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1839, when a Lutheran minister working at a mission for children created a wreath out of the wheel of a cart. He placed twenty small red candles, and four large white candles inside the ring. The red candles were lighted on weekdays and the four white candles were lighted on Sundays. Eventually, the Advent wreath was created out of evergreen foliage, symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death, as the evergreen lives on as other vegetation dies off. The circle reminds us of God's unending love, and the eternal life He makes possible. It is a symbol of the season, with a candle lighted each of the four Sundays leading up to, and on Christmas Day. The light of the flickering candle flames reminds us of who our Saviour is: "In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (Jn 1:4-5) Each candle represents something different, although traditions vary. Sometimes all the candles are red, a sign of the Lord's Precious Blood; in other traditions, all four candles are blue or white. Often, the first, second, and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-coloured, and some have a fifth white candle which is placed in the middle of the wreath and is lighted on Christmas Day to celebrate our Saviour's birth.

The first candle symbolises hope and is called the "Prophet's Candle." The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival. The purple colour symbolises royalty, repentance, and fasting. The second candle represents faith and is called "Bethlehem's Candle." Micah had foretold that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, also the birthplace of King David. The second candle is also purple to symbolise preparation for the coming king. The third candle symbolises joy and is called the "Shepherds' Candle." To the shepherds' great joy, the angels announced that Christ came for humble, unimportant people like them, too. In the liturgy, the colour rose signifies joy. This candle is the same colour to represent joyfulness and rejoicing. The fourth candle represents peace and is called the "Angels' Candle." The angels announced that the Messiah came to bring peace. He came to bring people close to God and to each other again. This colour is also purple to represent the culmination of love through the Messiah. The (optional) fifth candle represents light and purity and is called "Christ's candle." It is placed in the middle and is lighted on Christmas Day. This candle is white to represent pure light and victory.
