FIFTH SUNDAY of Year A 5th February 2023

GOING TO THE MARGINS "With the images of salt and light, Jesus says what he expects from his followers. They don't need to be always thinking about their own interests, their own prestige, their own power. Even though they are a small group in the huge Roman Empire, they are the «salt» and the «light» that the world needs. "You are the salt of the world." The simple people of Galilee spontaneously knew what he meant. They knew what salt is good for: giving food flavour and conserving it from spoiling. Just so, we need to contribute to helping people find the savour in life. "You are the light of the world." Without sunlight, our world would stay dark and gloomy. Jesus' disciples can shine a light to probe the meaning of life, to walk with hope.

These metaphors have something vital in common. If the salt stays in the shaker, it doesn't do its proper work. Only when it dissolves in the food can it give flavour to what we eat. The same thing happens with light. If it stays closed up and hidden away, it can't enlighten anyone. Only when it shines out in the dark can it illuminate and guide. A church isolated from the world can be neither salt nor light.

Pope Francis called on Catholics today to "go out to the margins." He preferred a church that is "bruised and dirty because it has been out on the streets" to one that is "clinging to its own security, caught up in a web of procedures." We can't hunker down in our structures with passive hope. The Gospel invites us to run the risk of meeting face to face with others. It wants to promote culture of encounter, because what our church needs today is to heal wounds and to warm hearts." COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS? Bishop Philip writes, "I have been asked a couple of times recently, now that the pandemic seems to be subsiding, whether at Mass it will once again be possible to offer Holy Communion under both kinds. We have discussed this matter recently at a Bishops' Conference meeting. The Church, of course, has never mandated that both species must be offered to the faithful at Mass nor that the faithful must receive Holy Communion under both kinds. The choice, when available, is left to the communicant. The Council of Trent taught that "the whole and entire Christ and the true sacrament are received under either species." For many centuries the norm has been for the faithful to receive under one kind, the Host, and this is often the case anyway, especially at large gatherings or when for some reason, Communion under both kinds is not possible. However, as the General Instruction on the Roman Missal asserts, the "meaning" of Communion is most clearly signified when given under both species— both the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood. For many communicants, receiving under both kinds is a true, spiritual joy. So, when can the practice of offering to those who wish Holy Communion under both kinds be restored? The Bishops' Conference hopes that the practice can be restored soon and is currently taking further medical advice in relation to the COVID safety protocols. The Bishops would also want, before any restoration of the practice, to ensure that a renewed and effective catechesis is given. So, watch this space!"

THANK YOU Pokesdown and Southbourne Children's Centre team would like to say a huge thank you for the ongoing food support for local families. It has made such a difference this Winter, especially with the increase in food and fuel prices. If we have had more than our families have needed, we have shared the surplus with Bournemouth Food Bank in Havilland Road, and Southbourne Food Bank at Immanuel Church. Through your generosity we have been able to give out 607 food bags to local families during 2022. This is all the more appreciated because we know everyone is impacted by rising prices, and finding the extra to donate to others may not be easy.

We aim to make up bags that are especially suitable for families with children under five years old. At the moment we are short of boxes of cereals for this age group such as cornflakes, Shreddies, Cheerios, Rice Krispies. We also particularly need tins of fruit, custard, rice pudding, tuna, and "meals in a tin" such as chicken, or other meat in sauce. We would also be very grateful for any spare carrier bags please.
