THE FREEDOMS WE ENJOY I am writing this on Thursday morning. Like many people in this country and beyond. I am looking forward to watching Saturday's Coronation ceremony in Westminster Abbey – with the parades that go with it. Given it is seventy years since Queen Elizabeth II was crowned, this weekend will be memorable. It is almost inevitable that some will use the opportunity to protest with chants and banners. Whilst that it is their right, I hope it doesn't spoil and event which has demanded all the work, preparation and rehearsals that have gone into it. Thankfully we live in a society where people are able to express their thoughts and opinions, whether we agree with them or not.

Later today I shall make my way to the local Polling Station to vote in the election of Local Councillors. At grass-roots level, this feels about as far removed from the Coronation as you can get. But there are common threads. The thousands of candidates who put themselves forward for election to serve the local community do so with a desire to serve. And we have the right to vote, to choose, to select those we want to entrust with issues that affect our daily lives. [I see that the lack of a lift at Pokesdown Station is one subject that keeps coming up.] We are fortunate to have men and women willing to stand for election - and we should value the vote we have

A willingness to serve, as a crowned Head of State or as a Local Councillor, is important. In so many countries today, the population is denied the ability to vote and to elect those who govern them. We can so easily take this for granted – in fact many people never bother to vote in any elections – but it is worth reflecting on just how valuable this is. With all its problems and faults, I would always prefer to live in a democracy. Millions on our planet never get that opportunity. Father John
