THE ROAD WE TRAVEL During the week the deaths of two well-known people were announced: George Alagiah and Sinead O'Connor. George was for many years the anchor on BBC's Six O'clock news; Sinead was an Irish-born singer, songwriter and activist. George died at the age of 67 after years battling with bowel cancer; Sinead was just 56. If you read accounts of their lives you'd be hard pressed to find two more different individuals.

George Alagiah was born in Sri Lanka, his family then moved to Ghana before he went as a boarder to the De La Salle College in Southsea. A foreign correspondent and journalist who specialised in African development and politics before later moving to present the news. His watchword was that it was his job to tell the stories of others - not voice his own opinions. He was married for many years and had two sons. His tight and loving family undoubtedly shaped the way he was able to face cancer with a certain serenity and peace. By all accounts, at the end he was as ready as he could be.

Sinead O'Connor first came to most people's attention in 1990 with a hauntingly beautiful rendition of the song 'Nothing Compares 2 U' (written by Prince). You'd need a heart of stone not to be moved by the video of her singing words which clearly mean so much to her. Born in Ireland, Sinead kicked against many of the norms and was outspoken and controversial. She sometimes did things which deeply offended others, not least Catholics. She married four times and had four children. At one time she lost custody of her son Shane and was then devastated by his death at the age of seventeen. She came across at times as a tortured soul struggling to find peace. But she certainly left her mark and made a difference to others.

Two very different journeys through life – but with one destination. How we get there is along our own unique path, with God by our side. We make a contribution and then ask God to welcome us into his Kingdom with open arms. May George and Sinead and all the departed rest in peace. Father John

REVISED PASTORAL AREAS - News from the Bishop. Over the last three to four years, we have been discussing the future of the Diocese and our ten-year mission plan 'You Will be My Witnesses'. The mission-plan revolves around two priorities: (1) Putting Christ at the Centre – which means renewing the prayer and spiritual life of the Diocese, renewing our parish and diocesan Liturgy, making our parishes and schools more welcoming and inclusive, creating opportunities for formation of laity and clergy, and also how to engage our youth. In other words, over the next ten years, we need first, to work at deepening our faith and love.

The second priority is (2) Building outward-looking Missionary Communities - that is, parishes and communities of faithful focused on mission and evangelisation, on service of the poor and needy in the neighbourhood, on collaborating ecumenically and interreligiously, on responding to Laudato Si' and on the good stewardship of resources.

To enable this to happen and to release the necessary resources, our 87 parishes (totalling 140 churches) will be united into 24 Pastoral Areas, similar to what we have now, although some are new or amended. Over the next ten years, these 24 Pastoral Areas will organically become single canonical parishes: some soon, over the next two or three years, others medium term, say in five years' time, and the rest over the long term.

<u>BISHOP COMMENTS ON ILLEGAL MIGRATION BILL 2023</u> The Illegal Migration Bill has now become law (20 July) after a series of votes in the House of Lords failed to result in further modern slavery protections & child detention limits.

"Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees, **Bishop Paul McAleenan**, says the Church will continue to 'love the stranger' and call for the expansion of safe routes for those fleeing their homes: "This legislation stands at odds with the teaching of the Church on welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating refugees.

"Refugees are human beings made in the image and likeness of God, not a political problem to be solved. We must never make recognition of people's dignity dependent upon where they come from or how they reach our country. The biblical call to love the stranger is unequivocal and indiscriminate.

"As a Church, we will continue to welcome those seeking sanctuary here and call for the expansion of safe routes.
