A NEW YEAR? I've always felt that in many ways the rhythm of parish life mirrors the school year. After a summer break people see September as a new beginning. This week our schools welcome back pupils and staff for the autumn term. Sixty young children will begin at Corpus Christi School in Reception; all the others move up one year. In July we said goodbye to the Year Six children who this week put on new uniforms and start Year Seven – no longer the oldest ('senior') pupils but the youngest in their Secondary Schools! We have seen a few changes in personnel, both teaching staff and support, at Corpus Christi and St Peter's. There is usually an energy and sense of purpose as classes plunge into the excitement of a new year in school. Then there are those who received their exam results this summer and move on to 'A Levels', or other courses – not forgetting the students preparing for University or College life.

In the parish too, we restart. A priest once said to me that, if you don't make the most of the autumn months in a parish to get some things done, the year will slip away from you! We all know the feeling. Over the past two weeks I have floated the idea of forming groups to enable people to deepen and develop their faith. I think the first step is to hold an open meeting for anyone who might be interested (date and details in next week's Newsletter) so that together we can look at how to set this up. But this won't be something the priest establishes and then tries to convince people to join. If it is to work then members of our community need to decide whether it is something worthwhile and deserving of a commitment of their time. In short, to happen it must belong to us as a parish.

Meanwhile, we wish our schools the very best as they return. Personally, I have missed the sound of young voices next to the church during our 10am weekday Masses! **Father John**

POLICE INVESTIGATION CONTINUES ON BOSCOMBE OVERCLIFF You will probably be aware of the recent finding of partial human remains on the nearby Manor Zig Zag. **The police have issued an appeal for any information.**

"I would like to renew my appeal to anyone with any information regarding this matter, or who has seen any suspicious activity around the area of the Manor Steps Zig Zag in Boscombe in recent days, to please inform police. THE FEAST DAY OF THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY is on **Friday, 8th September** – a great day to go to Mass, if you can. The origin of this feast day is connected with the basilica constructed in the fifth century on the site of the pool at Bethesda (cf. John 5: 1-9). That was the supposed location of the house of SS. Joachim and Ann, the parents of the Blessed Virgin. The feast spread through the East in the six century and was introduced at Rome by Pope Sergius I (d. 701). The prayers of the Mass provide a biblical foundation for this feast. In the opening Collect, the Church prays that this feast “may bring deeper peace to those for whom the birth of her Son was the dawning of salvation.” The same theme is found in the Introit or Entrance Antiphon, which refers to Mary from whom “arose the sun of justice, Christ our God.” The focal point of this feast is Jesus Christ, the Son of God born of Mary. From her, as the Prayer over the Gifts says, Jesus Christ “was pleased to take flesh.” The liturgy of this feast reminds us of what the Second Vatican Council said in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy Sacrosanctum Concilium, that Mary is inseparably linked with her Son’s saving work. An ancient Preface – although one not incorporated into the Roman Missal – says: Today we celebrate that happy day on which the glorious and immaculate Mother of God appeared in the world like a shining star. After the sin of the first woman, there was finally opened to us the long-desired gate of life and we have been called by the Son of the Virgin Mary out of the darkness into the joy of eternal light. **Let us celebrate Mary’s birthday, thankful for her prayers and asking her intercession for all our needs.** Source: <https://mailchi.mp/portsmouthdiocese/issue419?e=33de2bb10c>
