FORMING SMALL GROUPS In recent Newsletters I have floated the idea of forming a number of small groups to focus on whatever parishioners feel would help them to grow in faith. These could be Prayer Groups, Bible Study Groups, Discussion Groups about our Faith. In fact, they can take the shape and form that works best for those interested in taking part. It would be for those who sign up to agree when and where to meet. For these to work it does need a certain commitment but they can be extremely helpful as we all search for ways to deepen and develop the gift of faith we have received. If we are to be effective ministers of the Gospel to the world in which we live then we need to continue our own journey of growing in faith. There are Forms available this weekend which I invite you to use to indicate what you might be interested in doing. Nothing is written in stone but to get the ball rolling we need to know who is keen – and what you might be most interested in doing.

GREAT SADNESS As we watch and read news from around the world, there are times when events unfold which can leave us deeply distressed – and often feeling powerless. The unspeakable tragedy which struck Libya this week has devastated a country already torn apart by warring factions. Libya has had no effective government for the past nine years and is ill-equipped to deal with the loss of life and destruction that the floods caused in Derna. Whole buildings containing sleeping families were washed into the sea. The Mayor has estimated that as many as 20,000 people may have died. And this comes soon after the earthquake in Morocco. These disasters come out of the blue and seem to strike communities which are already up against it. Not all can be explained by climate change but without doubt this is a factor in many of the extremes we now see around the world. Whilst we cannot undo what has unfolded, it must surely make us consider even more urgently how we protect and safeguard the planet we occupy. At the same time, it gives us cause to consider what belonging to the human race means: after all, those suffering in Morocco and Libya are our sisters and Father John
