STEWARDS OF CREATION Christians have always understood the privilege – and responsibility – we have as guardians of God's created world. We do not 'own' this world; it belongs to God and is entrusted to us to be used wisely and carefully, to be protected and then handed on to future generations. It is only in more recent years that societies have begun to take this seriously and now we hear about the challenge of 'climate change' on a daily basis. For too long we have used up resources which cannot be replaced without much thought for the impact. If you ever watch David Attenborough's amazing wildlife programmes and the dangers many species face you cannot help but be concerned.

Balancing the longer-term good of our planet (with all the people who will live here after us) with short-term issues is not easy. The temptation is to push off into the future those decisions we find tough. There has been much talk this week about our Government's rebalancing of the need to reduce carbon emissions to zero by 2050 with the pain felt by households and businesses in the present. No one said this would be easy and to an extent we are living with the consequences of not treating this seriously for too long. But leaving the problem to future generations is not a responsible approach. In this country we have already piled up hundreds of billions of pounds of debt which children not yet born will be trying to repay in fifty or sixty years' time. What a legacy.

True Stewards of God's Creation – as we are called to be – must do everything in their power to correct what has been done and then protect it. I remember years ago visiting Port Lympne Safari Park in Kent where they run programmes to save endangered species. On the gate of more than one field was a description of the animal within and a note saying that "your grandchildren are unlikely to see one of these animals." Children today could quite rightly turn to us older generations and say: "what have you done? What are you handing on to us?" I'm not sure how I would answer that. Father John

POPE CALLS FOR OCTOBER TO BE DEDICATED TO PRAYING FOR PEACE IN UKRAINE Insisting that there is "a need for more prayer, for conversion, and an end to the conflict" in Ukraine, and in a response to a request from Ukrainian Bishops, Pope Francis "expressed his desire that during the month of October, the Rosary be dedicated to peace and reconciliation in Ukraine." The appeal to dedicate October to prayers for



peace in Ukraine came during a meeting with the Bishops of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, who were holding their annual Synod in Rome. The Pope was greeted by Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk, "who recalled the painful situation in which his country finds itself, with an increasing number of dead, wounded and tortured people, and who thanked the Pope for the affection shown in so many ways and on so many occasions." Pope Francis spoke about "his sorrow for the sense of helplessness experienced in the face of war," which he ascribed to "the devil, who desires to destroy." He turned his thoughts especially to the Ukrainian children he has met. "They look at you and have forgotten their smile," he lamented. "This is one of the fruits of war: taking children's smiles away from them." Finally, Pope Francis "recalled the example of Jesus during the Passion, who did not remain a victim of insults, torture, and crucifixion, but bore witness to the courage to speak the truth, to be close to the people so that they would not be discouraged." "This is not easy," the Pope said. However, he continued, "This is holiness, and the people want us to be saints and teachers of this way that Jesus taught us." Pope Francis said "that he remembers the Ukrainians every day in his prayer before the icon of the Virgin," . Extracted from vaticannews va

109TH WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES Today is World Day of Migrants and Refugees. It is an opportunity for parishes and communities to learn more about refugees and migrants on the move, to pray for them, and work together for positive change. The theme of this year's WDMR is "Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay". In his message, Pope Francis recognises and gives voice to an unfortunate reality of today's world: that for many, migration is forced and involuntary. Poverty, persecution, war, and instability are amongst the many reasons why people are forced to leave their homes to search for safety and a better life. Pope Francis rightly reminds us that "eliminating these causes and thus putting an end to forced migration" will require a shared commitment by all. However, he is also aware that this will not be easy and will take a long time. Therefore, until we live in a world where all people have true freedom to choose whether to migrate or to stay, it is essential that we meet our responsibility to welcome and assist people who seek safety and refuge.
