## 33rd Sunday Year A - 19th November 2023

"THE LAST THINGS" As we near the conclusion of another year in the Christian calendar [we start a 'New Year' with the beginning of Advent] the Readings and liturgy steer our thoughts forward to the life which comes after our time on earth. As St Paul reminds us in today's Second Reading, this is not morbid or depressing – it is reality and we should embrace it with true Christian hope: "you are all children of light and children of the day; we do not belong to the night or to darkness." None of us are here forever: the time will come for every one of us to answer the Lord's call to let go of this existence so that we can continue our journey towards the fulness of life in heaven.

That all sounds beautiful – and it is. But one of the hardest things we ever face is the loss of someone we love, who is precious to us and has made a huge difference in our lives. We can know deep down that, when they die, they go to "a better place" and often this is accompanied by relief from pain and any suffering which has been part of the final stages of life. But, on the other hand, we don't want them to go. By the way, I believe that one of the greatest innovations has been the hospice movement which provides places of peace and sanctuary as those final days arrive. Over and over again I have witnessed families given an opportunity to spend time in a quiet setting with a loved one who is nearing death, thanks to the provision of a room in a Hospice. This has eased what is an incredibly difficult time for any family.

Death is not a sign of failure. Death is the gateway to a life more glorious. The Church encourages us to get on and live our lives as well as we can - but always with an eye on where this life is taking us. In the meantime, as today's Gospel tells us, we have been given gifts to use in service of God in one another. These gifts, whatever they might be, are there to be used – not hidden away. With gifts from God comes the expectation that they will be put to good use with generosity. Father John

**DOMESTIC ABUSE HELP** - Ask for ANI (Action Needed Immediately) is a codeword scheme that provides a safe, discreet and confidential way for victims of domestic abuse to access immediate help from their local pharmacy or jobcentre. All our local Boots pharmacies have a safe space.

**How to get help**: Go to the location, approach a member of staff and Ask for ANI ('Please can I speak to ANI') or ask to use a Safe Space ('Do you have a Safe Space available?') You will be taken to a private space where a trained member of staff will support you and you can decide what to do next. A Safe Space is a safe and confidential room where victims can take some time to reflect, access information on specialist support services or call friends or family.
