SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT Year B - 10th December 2023

THE HOLY LANDS The Catholic Church has a structure which ensures every human being has access to pastoral care and the sacraments. What do I mean? Our parishes have boundaries not to carve up territory but to make sure everyone knows to whom they can go if needing baptism. a wedding, preparation for the Sacraments, a visit to someone sick or housebound. No one is left out. Every parish belongs to a diocese with a Bishop who oversees that pastoral provision to ensure everyone belongs.

Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzabella is the Patriarch (a particular sort of Bishop) based in Jerusalem and with responsibility for the Holy Lands. Note that 'Holy Lands' is plural as he cares for the people of Israel and Palestine, Cyprus and Jordan. It is a huge task and one which brings him in contact with some of the most difficult issues of our time, including the suffering of people in Gaza. A Bishop is not just appointed to look after "his flock" or members of his church. He is there for all. The Cardinal has stated that this Advent in the Holy Lands is a penitential time: recognising the human toll war takes on the vulnerable and innocent, he said it is necessary to reduce any sense of festivity at a time of year when it normally takes hold. In places like Bethlehem there will be no visitors this year and this has a devastating on an already fragile local economy as hotels stand empty and shops have no customers.

In our parishes at Christmas we normally put out a basket for 'Crib Offerings' and people contribute. This year what you give will go to The Friends of the Holy Land, an organisation based in this country which strives to give practical help to families who are struggling to access healthcare or education in the West Bank and Gaza. This is only a suggestion, but if each of us sacrificed one small thing during Advent, held on to the money we save and donate it with the Crib Offerings we could send even more practical help to those in huge need. Often, as we witness global events, we feel frustration and helplessness that there is little we can do to make a difference. This is one way we could genuinely help. I leave it with you, as a suggestion of how we can show solidarity Father John

THANK YOU "The staff and families at YMCA Bournemouth Children's Centres send Christmas blessings and grateful thanks for the wonderful support of Corpus Christi parishioners and local schools this year. We understand with rising costs how hard it can be for households to give to others, but our Food Bank has never been empty, and at times we have been able to share excess with other agencies in the area.

This year we have given 275 food bags to local families, with an additional 222 bags going to support the community via YMCA housing, other local foodbanks, Health visiting team, and YMCA Pre-School families. Food is distributed to families in hardship across all local YMCA Children's Centres. We always aim to add a box of cereal, milk and fruit juice to the bags to give children a good start to the day. Some families are in poorly equipped accommodation, so meals that can be easily heated by hob or microwave are especially welcome. We have been able to offer baby milk and food to families with young children using the NHS clinics at the centres. The YMCA housing across four projects has 114 beds for people who would otherwise be homeless. Costs for catering have increased this year so we have been supporting the hostel with staples such as tea, porridge oats, rice, pasta and baked beans when we have more than enough for our families.

Our storage space is limited, so in times of plenty we also share excess food and toiletries with Southbourne and Boscombe food banks, as well as items we can't add to our general family food bags, such as pet food, or products containing nuts or alcohol. Thank you all very much for your generosity. Your donations are always so much appreciated, and make a real difference to those in need in our community.
