'CHRISTMAS COMES ONCE MORE' Last week when I was deleting documents on my computer I came across an Address I gave to the soldiers of the 2nd Battalion, the Yorkshire Regiment, two years ago. The audience was about 500 mainly young soldiers, many who have children and a lot with no religious belief or faith. This is what I said.

"At the heart of the Christmas story is something very simple, profound and human. The story of Christmas is about the birth of a baby, in Bethlehem. For some of us Jesus is at the heart of what we believe as Christians. But for those who do not share that belief there is still something to take from what happened all those years

The birth of a baby is a magical moment. For those of you who have children of your own, remember back to when you held your son or daughter for the first time. The nervousness, the joy, the feeling of elation and also the struggle to put into words what you held in your heart. And for those who do not have children, think about that moment when your parents held you in their arms for the first time. Relieved that the birth had gone smoothly and caught up in a time of celebration as they welcomed a new member into the family. I think all new parents have a mixture of feelings at that moment: some anxiety about what kind of world their child will grow up in – with its challenges and difficulties. But more importantly parents have hopes for their small newborn: that he or she will grow up to be someone with their own character, strengths and who will make a difference in the lives of others.

One of the Carols sung on Christmas night is O Little Town of Bethlehem. At the end of one verse it says: "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." As Mary and Joseph gazed at Jesus, they too had hopes and fears, joy and anxiety. Just like any parent - and just like our parents.

This year has brought its challenges – different from last year but nevertheless demanding. Some of you will look back on this year and think it has been a good year, others will feel it was average. And let's be honest, there will be some who are glad this year is coming to an end because it hasn't been good for them. But as we come towards the end of one year and the start of a new one, ask yourself this question: what are your hopes for the year ahead, for yourself and your family? What do you hope for?

Whatever we believe or don't believe about the meaning of Christmas, one thing we can all agree upon is that it's a great time for connecting up with family and friends. Some of us are able to spend Christmas with our families – some of us are not able to and have to rely on phone calls and other means to catch up. That's life. But here's a small suggestion. If there is one person you can think of who you haven't spoken to for a while – for whatever reason – give them a call or send them a message. A small effort could actually make a real difference to that person." Father John
