LOOKING AHEAD We are only a couple of weeks into the New Year and already we are being asked to cast our gaze forward. With this Newsletter is a letter from our Bishop which concerns preparations for a Holy Year – a Year of Jubilee – announced by Pope Francis for 2025. Bishop Philip, echoing the Pope's message, underlines that we need to prepare ourselves and our parish communities if we are to gain the maximum benefit from the Holy Year. This is about spiritual preparation but also making plans and decisions which have practical implications. It also fits in with the published Vision for the Diocese of Portsmouth. We cannot avoid or brush aside the serious issues we face in being ready for the challenges the coming years are likely to bring.

To kick-start the process in Corpus Christi Parish we will hold two Open Meetings for parishioners. These will be in February and the idea is that people try to attend one of the two meetings. The same ground will be covered in both and the idea of two dates is because not everyone will be able to make a single date so this spreads the opportunity. At those meetings we will begin the task of considering how this Parish moves forward, for the Holy Year and with the Diocesan Vision in view. Those two dates will be announced very soon and I would then encourage EVERY member of the Parish to come along to one or the other. When I arrived as your priest nearly eighteen months ago I made the point that this is YOUR PARISH, not mine. Some of you have been here for many years. Others have arrived more recently - like me. I suspect the majority of you will be here after I've gone. Therefore, it is vital that parishioners of all ages, all backgrounds, all nationalities, engage with this conversation about the future. We all have a part to play and a voice to be heard.

One practical matter that the parish must address is how we best use the buildings and assets we have inherited from the Jesuit Order. The Parish Hall/Centre is a particular concern. Whatever conclusion we come to about these buildings is not for me alone to decide. We have limited money, we have fewer people with the time and energy to manage these matters and so we must face reality. Just as you do in your families, we as a parish must live within our means. At the moment we spend more than comes in and that cannot continue.

So, the future holds big challenges for us. But it also brings great opportunities for growth, for a re-focus on what is truly important. That's what Pope Francis desires for the Church spread across the world. And that lies behind the Vision for our Diocese. But none of that will bear fruit unless we, as individuals and parishes actually get stuck, engage and take a full part. Are you ready for this? Father John

JUBILEE YEAR 2025

The Second Sunday of the Year

Dear Friends.

As we embark on the new year 2024, the Holy Father has invited us to prepare for the Jubilee Year of 2025, entitled 'Pilgrims of Hope'. In his letter promoting the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis recalls the suffering and hardships that many of us experienced during the pandemic. In a time where many countries also suffer the effects of war and the climate crisis, Pope Francis sees the Jubilee Year 2025 as an opportunity to restore hope, a time of renewal and rebirth. The Jubilee Year will begin on 24th December 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica and will draw to a close on the feast of Epiphany, January 2026.

In preparation for the Jubilee Year, the Pope has proclaimed this year 2024 to be a year of prayer in preparation. It will focus on that prayer given to the disciples, the 'Our Father.' The Our Father not only reminds us that God is our Father but also reminds us of the union we share as brthers and sisters in Christ.

The word jubilee derives from the Hebrew, 'Jobel', which means 'a ram's horn.'

The instrument would be blown indicating the start of the year. In the Old Testament, for the Israelites, the jubilee was a time of universal pardon. In the Book of Leviticus, the Lord says, "And you shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you: you shall return, every one of you, to your property and every one of you to your family." The year was seen as a time to reestablish relationship with God, with each other, and creation. This would see misappropriated land returned to their owners, debts forgiven, Hebrew slaves set free, and a fallow period for the land to recover. In the New Testament, on the Sabbath day in the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus reads the Jubilee prophecy (see Luke 4:16-21) from the prophet Isaiah (61:1-2) and proclaims that it would be fulfilled through him,

"The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lords's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn..." The true jubilee is Jesus Christ himself. While in the jubilee of old slaves were set free from bondage and united with their families and homeland, in Jesus, we are freed from the bondage of sin and death. Jesus unites us to our true family, the family of God (the Church), and to our true homeland, heaven.

On 22nd February,1300, Pope Boniface XIII introduced the first jubilee, also known as a holy year, to mark the beginning of that century. Pope Boniface recommended that a jubilee year take place every hundred years. Later popes changed the intervals between years, and jubilees are now celebrated every 25 years, although sometimes a pope may add an additional "extraordinary" year, such as the 2016 'Year of Mercy.' Since 1300, the church has celebrated 28 jubilees, the most recent being celebrated in preparation of the millennium year during the papacy of St John Paul II. A jubilee year commemorates a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, themes reflected also in the Lord's prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

During this coming year of prayer, let us also (re)consider the Spiritual Works of Mercy. Just as Jesus was attentive to the practical needs of those He encountered in His ministry, the spiritual works of mercy call us to reach out to our neighbour and attend to their spiritual needs too. The seven spiritual works of mercy are: counselling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, admonishing the sinner, comforting the sorrowful, forgiving injuries, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead. In the parable of the sheep and goats, Jesus commends the ones who show mercy to those who are suffering and marginalised (Matthew 25:31-46.) Mercy is a virtue in which one is called to have compassion for another, and if possible, to alleviate their suffering. At a time when the Church focuses on forgiveness and reconciliation, the spiritual (and corporal) works of mercy are about helping those on the journey of faith and those who are searching to be reconciled with God, the Church and with others.

So, as we begin this year of prayer in preparation for the Holy Year 2025, let us daily contemplate the 'Our Father' and extend that prayer in practice through performing the seven spiritual works of mercy.
