THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD Year B - 7th January 2024

A NEW YEAR HAS BEGUN

I don't know whether you are someone who goes in for New Year's Resolutions. A lot of people have given up on them because their past experience hasn't been too positive and whatever was intended rapidly fell by the way. But if you have decided to use the start of another year to really make an effort to change or try a new activity – I hope it goes well.

One of the fundamental times in our week is coming together to celebrate Mass on Sunday (or the Vigil on Saturday evening). In his recent Pastoral Letter, Bishop Philip asked whether we saw this as an 'extra' we do on Sundays or whether that time we set aside is pivotal, central in our week. Do we look forward to it? For all of us, including those who do regularly come along, it is a valid question. So easily what we do can become habit and then the familiar is taken for granted and not always considered, or truly valued and honoured.

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church it says that the faithful are required to "participate in the Eucharistic celebration when the Christian community gathers together on the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord" [n.2042]. It is worth noting that the word 'participation' is used – it doesn't say just 'attend'. We should involve ourselves, enter into the celebration and approach it with reverence.

I have noticed here at Corpus Christi a growing trend for people to arrive after the start of Mass. At one Mass recently, of a congregation numbering about 160, more than forty turned up after Mass had begun. Some arrived fifteen minutes late for a Mass that lasted forty-five minutes. I don't believe that is true to the spirit of us 'participating' in the Eucharistic celebration. There will always be times when we are late for a good reason. But arriving when the Readings have almost finished, week after week, is not right. Even worse is walking in and disrupting those who have come on time. If you arrive late, at least wait until a suitable pause when you can make your way to a seat.

It is about us getting the most from the Liturgy (by hearing all the Readings) and respecting others in church by not coming in and disturbing them when they are trying to hear God's Word. Even if you do not bother with New Year's Resolutions, please give some thought to the point I'm making - for the sake of everyone who comes to Mass. I will contrive to make every effort to start Mass on time: all I ask is that everyone tries to be Father John there for the start so that we can properly celebrate together.

He hopes that the reflection in his message "will encourage efforts to ensure that progress in developing forms of artificial intelligence will ultimately serve the cause of human fraternity and peace. It is not the responsibility of a few but of the entire human family. For peace is the fruit of relationships that recognize and welcome others in their inalienable dignity, and of cooperation and commitment in seeking the integral development of all individuals and peoples. It is my prayer at the start of the New Year that the rapid development of forms of artificial intelligence will not increase cases of inequality and injustice all too present in today's world, but will help put an end to wars and conflicts, and alleviate many forms of suffering that afflict our human family. May Christian believers, followers of various religions and men and women of good will work together in harmony to embrace the opportunities and confront the challenges posed by the digital revolution and thus hand on to future generations a world of greater solidarity, justice and peace." BLESSING COUPLES IN IRREGULAR SITUATIONS With the Declaration Fiducia supplicans issued by the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, approved by Pope Francis, it will be possible to bless same-sex couples but without any type of ritualisation or offering the impression of a marriage. The doctrine regarding marriage does not change, and the blessing does not signify approval of the union. "When two people request a blessing, even if their situation as a couple is "irregular," it will be possible for the ordained minister to consent. However, this gesture of pastoral closeness must avoid any elements that remotely resemble a marriage rite. This is what is stated the Declaration "Fiducia supplicans" on the pastoral meaning of blessings, published by the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith and approved by Pope Francis. The document explores the theme of blessings, distinguishing between ritual and liturgical ones, and spontaneous ones more akin to signs of popular devotion. It is precisely in this second category there is now consideration of the possibility of welcoming even those who do not live according to the norms of Christian moral doctrine but humbly request to be blessed. 23 years have passed since the former "Holy Office" published a Declaration (the last one was in August 2000 with "Dominus Jesus"), a document of such doctrinal importance. "Fiducia supplicans" begins with the introduction by the prefect, Cardinal Victor Fernandez, who explains that the Declaration considers the "pastoral meaning of blessings," allowing "a broadening and enrichment of the classical understanding" through a theological reflection "based on the pastoral vision of Pope Francis." It is a reflection that "implies a real development from what has been said about blessings up until now, reaching an understanding of the possibility "of blessing couples in irregular situations and same-sex couples without officially validating their status or changing in any way the Church's perennial teaching on marriage." Also clarified is that to avoid "any form of confusion or scandal," that when a couple in an irregular situation or same-sex couples ask for a blessing, it "should never be imparted in concurrence with the ceremonies of a civil union, and not even in connection with them. Nor can it be performed with any clothing, gestures, or words that are proper to a wedding" (par. 39). This kind of blessing "may instead find its place in other contexts, such as a visit to a shrine, a meeting with a priest, a prayer recited in a group, or during a pilgrimage" (par. 40).

In conclusion, the fourth chapter (paragraphs 42-45) recalls that "even when a person's relationship with God is clouded by sin, he can always ask for a blessing, stretching out his hand to God" and desiring a blessing "can be the possible good in some situations" (par. 43)." 19th December 2023 Source: Vatican News (extracted)
