PREPARING FOR THE SEASON OF LENT

Your first reaction to reading this heading might be 'what? We've barely completed our celebration of the Christmas Season!' In fact, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple was on Friday 2 February and that marked the end of the Christmas Season. Now here we are, contemplating the start of Lent. Because Easter is early this year [31 March] so Lent begins early. By coincidence Ash Wednesday falls on the 14 February so some people may struggle to combine Fasting & Abstinence [the traditional way in which we mark the first day of Lent] with celebrations of Valentine's Day. I know which of the two the card and gift shops will be emphasising!

The reason I am highlighting Lent now, ten days ahead of Ash Wednesday, is that in order to make the most of the forty days of the Lenten Season, we ought to plan and at least decide what tools we want to use to help us on that journey. Here at Corpus Christi, we will have Stations of the Cross each Friday evening followed by Mass (in addition to the usual 10am Mass). But what you choose to do is a personal decision. Our church is open every day, usually from 8am until the evening. Why not come in and walk the Way of the Cross yourself. pausing to reflect at each of the 14 Stations? Or try and come to Mass once during the week. Or set aside some extra time for prayer at home, on your own or with other members of your family. Perhaps there is a book or some spiritual reading you have been meaning to engage with: what better time than Lent. Or plan to fast once a week, maybe eating and drinking less on a Friday, or another day. Towards the beginning of Lent we are encouraged to observe a Fast Day [Friday 23 February] and support the work of CAFOD.

The main purpose of Lent is to take us on a spiritual journey of renewal when we sift out those things in our lives which really don't need to be there. They can be things which are actually harmful to us or they may be distractions which divert us from what is truly important. We refocus our lives and this helps to prepare us for the greatest feasts, the most important time, in our year as Christians when we commemorate the death and resurrection of Jesus in Holy Week and Easter.

In ten days' time we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday. This year it falls during the half-term break so bringing children along to the 10am Mass that day would be a good way to help them launch into this beautiful season of self-reflection, renewal and preparation. Whatever we choose to do, let's make the most of Lent this year. Give it some thought and have a plan for what you intend to do. Father John
