THE MONTH OF MARY

Going back centuries, in many cultures May has been the month when we focus our devotion on Mary. In my experience, the place of Mary in Catholic teaching is often misunderstood by those who are not Catholic – and some who are. We can be criticised for "worshipping Mary" as though she was equal to God. This is not correct: we 'venerate' Mary highly because of the unique part she has played in God's Plan of Salvation. As the Mother of Christ she occupies a special place in history and in our Christian faith. Neither is her role confined to history. Moments before Jesus yielded up his spirit on the cross he gave Mary to his Church, represented by St John: 'woman behold your son; son behold your mother.' This bound Mary to us for all time in a unique way which is why we venerate her, celebrate her witness and ask her prayers.

On the Feast of the Ascension, which is marked next Thursday 9 May, we are encouraged to focus our prayer on the importance of Communication. This takes many shapes and forms but in particular we consider the ways we are able to communicate the Good News we have received. I can remember years ago when this was called 'Social Communication' and was all about the Church using newspapers (how many read those these days!), television and radio. How quickly things have moved on as now we develop websites and use 'social media'. As with everything, there are good sides to what has grown and developed – and there can be negatives when they are misused. A concern today is that progress is so rapid we don't have the chance to stop and reflect on what dangers there might be – until it's too late. Just think of the sheer volume of online abuse suffered by vulnerable children and adults.

In his message for 'World Communications' this year, Pope Francis has homed in on the leaps being made in Artificial Intelligence. I have to confess that I'm struggling to keep up with what now seems to be possible; perhaps you feel as bewildered as me. The Pope highlights some of the ethical questions surrounding the technology: how AI impacts on how we think, the dignity of work, how we use the information, its sourcing and accuracy, global regulation, to name but a few areas. Pope Francis is keen to stress that communication needs to be authentic and human. We must speak from that most human of organs, the heart. Whatever means we use to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ, people will always be able to tell if this is coming from our hearts – not just our lips. *Father John*
