## PENTECOST – BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH!

This is how today's Feast is sometimes described. The Apostles, gathered with Mary in a room out of sight and full of anxiety, are suddenly changed. The Holy Spirit of God, promised by Jesus, arrives and transforms them into people ready to 'go out to the whole world to proclaim the Good News'. No longer timid, nervous and afraid – they become bold and ready to communicate with anyone who will listen. And there is an audience ready and receptive: no matter where they come from, no matter what their native language, they are able to understand the message the Apostles proclaim. The Good News knows no bounds and is given to everyone, without exception. The only qualifying factor is people's readiness to receive and to hear this Good News.

As we pray for the Holy Spirit to take charge of us, shaping our personal choices and decisions, we pray too for things to change on a larger scale. Various politicians have warned recently that in the world today we face increased disruption and conflict in the coming years. This happens because leaders make bad decisions which seldom help their own people but instead are aimed at securing their own futures – no matter the cost in lives and livelihoods. It is now more than two years since President Putin ordered his troops to invade neighbouring Ukraine. Since last October the situation in the Middle East engulfing Gaza and Israel has left all of us appalled and distraught for the many innocent people suffering the consequences. Other conflicts pop up in the news periodically: the famine in Sudan; civil war in Yemen fuelled by other countries; the military oppression in Myanmar; ongoing agony caused by the Taliban in Afghanistan; Iraq, Syria and Iran where human rights have been crushed. Only this week the Prime Minister of Slovakia was shot, and protesters were on the streets in Georgia. We must never stop praying for these situations too – asking God to send his Spirit to challenge and change the hearts of those who have the power to steer a better course.


Next Thursday I leave for Lourdes to take part in the International Military Pilgrimage (IMP). I return the following Monday. This annual pilgrimage began in 1958 as an act of reconciliation between the French and German nations after the Second World War. The United Kingdom has supported this event for many years, at the invitation of the French Minister of Defence. There will be around 16,000 participants – all serving personnel wear uniform (sadly those of us who are no longer serving have to wear civilian attire!) and there are military bands taking part. There will also be personnel involved who were wounded, in body and mind, in recent conflicts such as Afghanistan and Iraq. It just so happens that the group of students from St Peter's School, who our parishes are supporting financially, will be there at the same time, so I'll look out for them. In my absence I am very grateful to Father Brendan and Father Denis for celebrating Mass. Whilst in Lourdes I shall, of course, pray for you. 'Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love'. *Father John*
