PALM SUNDAY Year C 13th April 2025

This most Holy Week

As we celebrate Passion Sunday with Palms, we enter into the most important week of the year. For Christians, this week is a holy time because of what we remember; because of what we do; because of the events which unfolded in Jerusalem more than two thousand years ago. There is no other time in the year like this.

The week begins with a Reading of the whole story, from Jesus sharing a Last Supper with his disciples, through his prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, his arrest, the judgement and then his death on the cross. This year we hear St Luke's account of these momentous, terrible, complex events. We join the crowds who greet Jesus with joy as he descends the Mount of Olives, across the valley and up through the city walls. All too quickly we hear Jesus predicting what will happen when he is arrested, tried and condemned. His disciples cannot comprehend. Despite all the things their Master has said, they have not fully understood – perhaps they are in denial. "This must not happen to you" one says; "Shall we draw swords to prevent this?" Only later will all become clear.

Then, as our Holy Week progresses, we are invited into the events which take place. On Thursday evening we witness Jesus washing the feet of his disciples, leaving a powerful and concrete sign of service – connected with his offering to them of his body and blood. On Good Friday afternoon at 3pm we gather to solemnly commemorate his suffering and death. We pray for all peoples and we venerate the wood of the Cross. Then there is silence ... emptiness ... a sense of someone no longer present in the way he had been. This lasts until the evening of Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil. Then the joy of Easter flows over into Sunday and on through the days of Easter Week, and indeed the Easter Season which runs all the way to Pentecost. It is the central event of Jesus overcoming death and rising to New Life that gives meaning to our Christian faith. Without this nothing else makes any sense.

If you have taken part in the liturgies of Holy Week before, you'll know how powerful and moving they are. If you have never come along – try to join us this year, for all or as many parts as possible. As well as the Triduum (the three Services on Thursday, Friday and Saturday/Sunday) we have Stations of the Cross on the morning of Good Friday at 10am and the Blessing of Easter Food on Saturday at 11am. And when you come, hold in your mind anyone or any particular situation you want to present to the Lord. Bringing our personal cares and concerns to Jesus as we witness the extent and depth of his love for us is a powerful way to be intimately involved. We don't just remember in Holy Week: we take part in these events – we are there with Jesus. *Father John*
