The Ascension of the Lord

Since Easter, we have been reflecting on the implications of Jesus rising from the dead. In the Gospel passages immediately after Easter Sunday we heard how Jesus appeared to individuals and groups of believers to prove that what he said would take place had indeed happened. The second reason was to strengthen and affirm faith in those who would be 'sent out to the whole world' to proclaim the Good News. These first followers needed to be quite sure that Jesus had risen, so that they could then give witness to others. In the Acts of the Apostles we have listened to how the Gospel spread, far from Jerusalem, thanks to the ministry of St Paul and all the Apostles.

Once Jesus had convinced these early disciples that he had overcome death, and that this opened the way to eternal life for all who believe in him, the time came when he would leave them and return to his Father. They would no longer see him in the way they had. The **Feast of the Ascension of Jesus** marks this moment when he disappears from their view. This coming Thursday, 29th May, is when we mark that departure. If at all possible, we should take part in a celebration of Mass as it is a Holy Day, forty days after Easter Sunday. At Corpus Christi we have <u>Mass at 10am</u> and 7pm that day.

But when Jesus left his friends, he promised to send them a gift, the Holy Spirit. This is what we celebrate at Pentecost, fifty days after Easter, on 7/8th June. In a few weeks' time Bishop Philip will come to Corpus Christi to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on 38 young people [35 from our parish and 3 from Our Lady Queen of Peace]. The Holy Spirit comes with gifts [identified as seven Gifts of the Spirit] which then produce fruit in us [named as twelve Fruits of the Spirit]. Please hold these young members of our community in your prayers.

On Saturday morning this weekend we welcomed fifty-eight children to the Table of Our Lord to receive him for the very first time in Holy Communion. What a joyous and memorable moment in their lives, and the lives of their parents and families. It is also a sign of hope in our church that children and young people are receiving what the Lord offers through the church – and we pray that the gift of faith in each of them will continue to be nurtured and grow. For those of us who have been receiving Communion for many years, there is always a danger that we lose a sense of the enormity of what we are doing: taking into ourselves the Body and Blood of Jesus himself. There is nothing greater than this.


