## How does our country move forward?

We are becoming used to political events moving very quickly across the Atlantic in the United States where decisions are sometimes made by a President on social media without warning. No one knows guite where things stand. In this country we expect events to unfold in a planned way. So, when we witness what happened this week in Parliament it can shake or disturb people who ask: 'what on earth is going on?'; 'what is the government up to?' 'what will happen next?' This week the issue was focused around trying to get a grip on the ballooning cost of benefits paid by the State (= Taxpayers). But this impacted the disabled and those most in need of support and assistance and provoked a predictable reaction amongst Members of Parliament. It all ended in a complete shambles with virtually no progress. And this seems to be the story of our time. Big, huge issues need to be addressed [social care for the elderly and infirm being one of the most important] but no forward movement is being made, no ideas about how to tackle these things are being proposed.

It could be argued that, at the root of our problems, lies an absence of any Moral Code. Without a Moral Code, we have no compass to steer us in the right direction. Without that compass we flounder looking for a 'quick fix' or 'solution' to this problem or that, without a cohesive and over-arching approach. Christians have a Moral Code built upon the Ten Commandments and then shaped by two thousand years of wise and saintly teaching through the church. Our society, our country, was founded upon Christian principles – but that connection has been lost.

What does this lack of a Moral Code mean in practice? One of the Ten Commandments states: 'Thou shalt not kill'. This means that you do not take a life, that of another or your own, from conception to natural death. It is clear and unequivocal. If embraced, then this principle would have shaped the recent votes in the House of Commons about changing the conditions for abortion and the vote to enable assisted suicide. That principle from our Moral Code leads us to the best - and right - answer. But it isn't what happened. Elected MPs wrestled with individual examples of people who suffered through illness and found death too painful. These were emotive and powerful accounts but not the right basis on which to make a decision. A good decision starts from the principles which are then applied.

In Christian teaching there is an important strand described as 'Moral Theology'. This explores the principles, the Moral Code, we have been given by God and looks at how it works in reality. For our country to be a healthy society, with clear sight of how to make the big and important decisions, we will need to rediscover a Moral Code. Without it we will be buffeted by events and struggle to know which way to turn. Jesus predicted as much at the end of the Sermon on the Mount when he described how a house built on sand, hit by wind and rain, would eventually collapse because it was not founded firmly on rock. A Moral Code is there to provide that solid base on which to build. Father John
