The People of Gaza

Many of us have watched with a growing sense of frustration, bewilderment and anger the pictures coming from Gaza. Before October 2023 living conditions on what was referred to as 'The Gaza Strip' were dreadful. Hemmed in, over two million people called it 'home'; even then it was one of the most densely populated pieces of land on earth. Currently, the whole population has been instructed to squeeze onto 12% of that territory. People must make their way to distribution centres run by an organisation set-up by Israel and the United States [not the internationally recognised UN and NGOs which have the skills needed in this area]. On a daily basis men, women and children are dying as they try to obtain the basics to survive - food and water. Just recently a number of children filling water containers died when an Israeli drone suffered what the IDF (Israel Defense Forces) described as a 'technical malfunction'. One of the fundamental principles of international law and conventions is that an occupying force must protect civilians. Israel refuses to allow international, independent journalists access to Gaza. Even so, news and photos emerging show that terrible things are happening to the population.

We should be crystal clear. Criticism of the State of Israel and its actions is not anti-semitic. Israel is a legal entity and a territorial State in law. As such it is required to observe international law. Neither should we forget what sparked the recent events in Israel and Gaza when terrorists ran amok and slaughtered men, women and children out of pure hatred. What Hamas did was abhorrent - and Israeli hostages are being held in Gaza. What is also evident is that many ordinary Israelis do not agree with the continuing actions of their own government in Gaza. The simple (probably too simple) explanation is that Prime Minister Netanyahu, desperate to remain in office to avoid personal court cases, is being dictated to by two extreme right-wing politicians in his government. Without their support his government would collapse and he would most likely be thrown out of office. These most right-wing politicians want to see the removal of all Palestinians from Israel. By the way, this is also being pursued in the West Bank as Settlers run a campaign of intimidation and murder - watched by the IDF and Police. We know that the Middle East is one of the most complicated political situations in the world and that there are no simple answers or solutions. But what is being done to the civilian population of Gaza is unconscionable. A 1948 Convention contains this definition of genocide: "acts committed with the intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnical, racial, or religious group as such." Lawyers will argue over the detail and whether this applies in Gaza. But, as Pope Leo said last weekend, echoed by Cardinal Parolin his Secretary of State: "this must stop."

Father Denis Blackledge SJ is undertaking a 24 hour fast to keep the situation in Gaza in people's thoughts and prayers. This will happen in Corpus Christi Church from the 10am Mass on Friday 8th August through to the 10am Mass on Saturday 9th August. This provides a symbolic gesture to overlap the Jewish and Muslim holy days. He invites anyone who would like to come and join him for any amount of that twenty-four hour period to sit in silence, to pray and to reflect. Please, make a note in your diary and set aside some time. Father John

FASTING FOR GAZA Fr Denis Blackledge of the Society of Jesus (Jesuit) will be undertaking a 24-hour water only fast in Corpus Christi church, Boscombe, **to begin after the 10am Mass on Friday 8th August, and end at 10am mass on Saturday 9th August.** Fr Denis says "The simple aim is to pray in silence for a stop to the genocide in Gaza and to provide a symbolic gesture to overlap the holy day of both the Muslim and Jewish religions. I shall simply sit somewhere in the altar area, and quietly be there. Other folk are obviously more than welcome to come and share silently, for as short or long a time as they wish, for the same intention."
