Bishop Philip's Visit to our Parish

Next Sunday, 14th September, Bishop Philip will celebrate the 10am Mass here at Corpus Christi, Afterwards there will be an opportunity to meet him in the Parish Centre over a drink and nibbles. Some years ago the Bishop visited for a more intensive insight into life in the parish: this time it is what I might describe as a visitation lite. Although we may not often stop to think about what is going on day-to-day, there is a lot which takes place: groups meet for prayer; programmes of sacramental preparation involve many families; connections with our local Catholic Schools continue to develop; and clergy change! In the wider community too, nothing stands still: our part of Bournemouth is blessed with a mix of people from many different nations, cultures and backgrounds. In that sense we truly represent the 'Catholic' nature of the Church. Of course, we face challenges but as part of a diocese led by Bishop Philip – we enjoy connections with other parishes and communities.

When a Bishop is appointed to a particular diocese, he is given care of the people and clergy of that portion of the People of God. In our case the Diocese of Portsmouth is mapped out as a territory: Hampshire, Berkshire, South Oxfordshire, the Isle of Wight, the Channel Islands and, most importantly, this small corner of Dorset (which was originally part of the County of Hampshire). But in the document read out when Bishop Philip was ordained as our Bishop he was encouraged to see his ministry as being to ALL people living in this area of the country - not just Catholics. For that reason a Diocesan Bishop must engage with the wider population, with other religious and civil leaders, and to speak out on issues which affect everyone.

The other vital role the Bishop fulfils is embodying our communion with each other. We are in communion with him; he is in communion with other Bishops (in particular the Bishop of Rome). It is one reason why, at every celebration of Mass, we pray for "Leo our Pope and Philip our Bishop". This expresses our communion. When you travel to other parts of the country or abroad and attend Mass you'll hear the name of the same Pope and then the name of the local Bishop. A network exists which binds us together.

Obviously one Bishop cannot be everywhere in the diocese all of the time. Which is where priests have a special part to play. They are collaborators with the Order of Bishops - they are, if you like, the people on the ground called to serve the local community. A Parish Priest celebrates the sacraments, administers the goods belonging to the parish, preaches the gospel and brings people before God in his daily prayer. Together with deacons, priests are the hands and feet, eyes and ears of the bishop in a particular place.

So, when Bishop Philip visits a parish community, he doesn't come to issue instructions about what priests and people should be doing. He trusts that, in communion with him, we know what we should be doing, empowered by the gospel. Instead, the Bishop comes to encourage, to affirm, and to listen so that he may understand better what our part of the diocese is dealing with and trying to achieve. Being a bishop can be tough going – he needs the support of our prayers, all of the time. Fr John
