World Peace Day: 21 September 2025

Every year, the United Nations nominates a day for a focus on the need for World Peace. The sad reality is that there are many, many parts of the world where peace is absent. In fact, whole Nations are in such a terrible state that citizens don't even dream of true peace; instead they just hope for an end to war - which is something different. Some of the conflict zones drift in and out of the news: Myanmar, Sudan, Haiti, Yemen, Iraq, Iran to name but a few. There are also countries where people are subjugated and oppressed, such as Afghanistan. Then there are those wars which do make it onto the front pages of newspapers, or the news bulletins: Ukraine and Gaza being the most obvious. But even these, after a number of years, struggle to hold people's attention as deaths and injuries continue to mount each day.

At Christmas, we send your Offerings left by the crib to one of two organisations: *The Friends of the Holy Land* and the *Knights of the Holy Sepulchre*. Both act as channels to fund Christian projects in Israel especially in the fields of health and education. Of course, the work done by these charities goes on all year round and any support is always welcome. The Friends of the Holy Land has asked that our focus this World Peace Day is on the suffering people of Gaza and the West Bank. A few weeks ago, Father Denis undertook a 24-hour Prayer Vigil to keep this particular conflict in our minds and our prayer. Throughout that period there were always people praying with him in the church – which shows just how deeply we feel about what we see and hear coming from the Middle East. Prayer is so important, especially when we can have a sense of helplessness in the face of decisions taken by foreign governments and their leaders.

This prayer was written by the Anglican Archbishop Hosam of Jerusalem:

Gracious Father, whose blessed Son Jesus Christ came down from heaven to be the true bread which gives life to the world: in your mercy, provide for all those in Gaza and beyond who suffer from hunger and starvation, that they may be given both physical bread to nourish their bodies and heavenly bread to sustain their souls.

By the power of your Spirit, bring a speedy end to this cruel war, the release of all captives, care for the sick and wounded, comfort for those who have lost loved-ones, and the opening of a pathway for a just and lasting peace in the very homeland where your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, ministered during his earthly life; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Whenever our prayer for a particular cause begins to flag, we should remember the parable of the widow who kept approaching a judge until he responded to her in a positive way and gave her what she asked for. The point Jesus was making in that story was simple: persevere – never give up.
