A lack of trust in our Institutions

This week tensions came to a head concerning an Inquiry the government announced months ago into Grooming Gangs. In recent years several court cases have revealed shocking and widespread abuse by men of vulnerable young women – many of whom were in Local Authority Care. It appears that in a number of instances the police failed to take seriously those girls who approached them for help. In addition, social workers and those responsible for the care of children from dysfunctional homes failed to act on reports of abuse. As a result, thousands of young women were trapped in a cycle of abuse which devastated their lives. One factor which has already emerged is that authorities were reluctant to act because a much of the abuse was perpetrated by men of Pakistani origin but to name this reality could have caused unrest and accusations of racial targeting.

Despite numerous calls for a National Inquiry, the government resisted. However, earlier this year the Prime Minister announced that there would be an inquiry and that survivors of the abuse would have a part to play. The furore this week came about because a number of those survivors have resigned from an Advisory Panel saying that they felt things were (a) moving far too slowly; (b) that their voices were being ignored or silenced and (c) the candidates to Chair the Inquiry had a background in two of the institutions which themselves failed, that is, the police and social work. It is difficult to understand what has brought about this breakdown, but one thing is clear: suspicion of the motives of large bodies which are there to serve the community is significant. Or, to put it the other way around: there is a real lack of trust in many parts of the State and Government.

This has come about as the result of huge scandals in recent decades. One example was Hillsborough where the truth was subverted. Another is the ongoing scandal of the injustices done to Post Masters and Post Mistresses. Yet another concerns the terrible impact of infected blood products given to patients. In all these cases there is a belief that the Government is deliberately dragging things out in the hope that more and more of those affected will no longer be with us. That is probably not a true reflection of what's happening but the very fact that people believe it demonstrates the low level of trust in our State Institutions.

Of course, we also must acknowledge that the institution of the Catholic Church has lost the trust and confidence of people who suffered abuse. In places where the rights of every individual should have been especially protected, we failed. And to make matters worse, some of those in authority who were aware mishandled situations or deliberately covered up abuse of minors by clergy.

This all matters because institutions [including the Monarchy in our country] should provide those fixed points of trust in a world where we can feel buffeted and battered, pushed and pulled in all sorts of directions. We ought to be able to trust the organs of government to be on the side of the people. Mistakes will be made; individuals and organisations get things wrong. But refusing to acknowledge the fact only compounds the hurt and deepens that lack of trust. This may all sound above and beyond most of us - but it really should concern us because it is eating away at the fabric of our society. And that will affect us all. Fr John
