## ALL SAINTS Year C 2nd November 2025

## November - a month for Remembrance

This month begins with the Feast of All Saints: men and women, young and old, bishops, priests, members of Religious Orders, lay people, martyrs, doctors of the church, ordinary people from every corner of the globe and every walk of life, who we believe are with God in heaven for all eternity. It's an important way to start November as it sets before us our goal, what God wants for us, and it encourages us to have hope and believe that we will join them when the time comes.

Then, in the light of All Saints, we commemorate All Souls: those we have known, family members and friends, parishioners, and all those who have no one to remember them and pray for them. We include All Souls in our prayers. To help us focus we have a Book of Remembrance near the altar in which you are welcome, once again, to record the names of those for whom we should pray. This is our duty as members of the church – just as those who have gone before us prayed so often for others, now we do it for them. Please note the date of our parish *Act of* Remembrance on Sunday 16th November at 3pm. At that time, we will recall those who have died, especially members of our parish who have left us in the past twelve months.

Then, set within the context of November as a month of remembrance, there are the events next Sunday and on Tuesday 11th November when the whole nation takes time to stop and remember the sacrifice made by so many in war. Whilst many will pause and rightly show respect, we as Catholics have a particular understanding of the need to pray for those who have died. Not all Christians share our theology about praying for the dead. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that praying for the dead is an act of communion with those who have died in God's grace but are still imperfectly purified. These souls undergo a final purification called Purgatory to achieve the holiness needed for heaven, and prayers can help them attain this. Therefore, our practice of praying for those who have died is rooted in the belief that all who die in God's friendship are on their way to heaven and that our prayers are a way to assist them on that journey.

Guiding us through this month, the Church puts before us in the Readings several passages which focus on what can be described as 'the last things'. All of this culminates in the great feast of Christ the King on 23rd November. Reflecting on death, it's meaning and the need to be prepared, is not morbid or depressing. It is reality and not something we should be anxious about or fear. It was Benjamin Franklin, writing to Jean-Baptiste Leroy in 1789, who came up with the famous line: "in this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes." When something is certain, a definite, then the sensible approach is to do what we can to be prepared. The month of November is a good opportunity to think more deeply about the preparations we can make. **Fr** John
