## **Standing With Giants**

Last week I visited Fort Nothe in Weymouth. The Fort itself is an interesting place to visit, built to protect Portland Harbour it was constructed between 1860 and 1872. But my main reason for going was to see the Standing With Giants Tribute to those who lost their lives in the Falklands Conflict. Many of us will remember the invasion of the Falkland Islands by Argentina and the decision [which some thought impossible] to send military personnel to retake the islands. The operation succeeded but with the loss of 255 people, including three Islanders. Many young Argentinian soldiers also died.



The Standing With Giants Tribute was an outdoor display of life-sized silhouettes, each one representing one of the fallen. Ranged around the battlements, and the inner courtyard, it was a moving experience to stop, remember the sacrifices made. A priest I know was a military Chaplain who served during that conflict in the South Atlantic and ministered to a number of those injured in horrific fires aboard navy ships. The name given to this display reflects the recognition that those who died in service of their country, doing their duty, were indeed remarkable individuals .... 'Giants'.

In the Scriptures too we come across 'giants'; figures who had such an important role in the story of salvation. This Sunday the Gospel introduces us to John the Baptist. He's a key figure in Advent as his message is proclaimed loud and clear: repent and believe. He uses baptism to mark the choice people made to leave old ways behind and get ready for the arrival of the Messiah who, we should remember, had been longed-for, waited for, hoped for, over centuries.

But just like so many in history who have left their mark, who have made a unique and powerful contribution, John the Baptist was typically self-effacing. He had a job to do, his duty, and he remained focused on what he had to do. His task was to prepare people for the coming of the Messiah - and he pointed them towards Jesus. As he said himself, 'I'm not worthy to undo the strap of his sandal'; and 'he must increase as I must decrease.' John never wanted attention or to create a cult-following. He knew Jesus was the One coming into the world to save us. That was all that mattered and anything he could do to ready people for this event he would do. It led to his death in a prison cell at the hands of Herod. But by then this 'giant' had done his duty.
