

The Life of Priests

One of the tasks I took on last year was to chair the Diocesan Priests' Retirement Fund. Monsignor Paul Townsend had filled this role for many years and when he stepped down Bishop Philip asked me to take it on. Those with long memories will recall an appeal thirty or so years ago to set up a fund to provide for priests when they retired from parish ministry. It means we can set them up with a decent place to live and ensure they have a reasonable personal income. If the time comes when a place in a Care Home is required, the Fund can help with that too.

One very enjoyable aspect of my role is to join the retired priests for lunch, once in the summer and once just before Christmas. We had lunch last Wednesday in Winchester. Not all our retired priests were able to come – some due to distance (a few are living in Ireland, one in France) and some because they couldn't make the journey. It was a jolly occasion and a chance for them to catch up over a good lunch. Inevitably, it was commented upon that some of those with us last December are no longer around: it comes to us all. Bishop Philip thanked those present because, although retired, a number still help out and cover Mass whilst other priests are away. In truth, many find it hard to 'switch off' and enjoy the chance to keep involved in what they have been doing for decades. One priest at the lunch is now in his mid-nineties!

The sense of what these priests have given in terms of service across our diocese over many years left me feeling thankful. They have witnessed a lot of changes in the Church since being ordained. This has required them to adjust, adapt, and find new ways of exercising priestly ministry which wasn't easy for all of them. They have also seen brother priests decide to leave ministry; they have also witnessed the terrible reality of abuse come to light. All of this has left its mark on men who gave their lives to work as priests. But what has always made it possible to continue is the connection with people, parishioners. The life of a priest is never something in isolation, a 'personal' privilege – it must always be lived in service of others. This gives the role meaning and purpose.

I was thinking about all of this during the week, and then I read the Bishop's *Pastoral Letter* which you'll hear today with a printed copy attached to the Newsletter. As priests, we ask ourselves how we could communicate better just what a marvelous privilege and wonderful vocation being a priest is. Perhaps we don't always allow or enable people to see what joy there is in accompanying people as their lives unfold – and celebrating key moments on that journey. Do we as priests project the joy and peace that comes with doing what the Lord had in mind for us? If it was more visible, then others might be tempted to think seriously about whether they too are being called to this way of life. If we look as though life as a priest is a burden, then others are less likely to wonder whether the Lord is calling them too. Most priests will tell you that one or two priests made a deep impression on them and prompted them to consider this vocation. Maybe priests have lost confidence – for all sorts of reasons – and a number just feel worn out and disappointed that fewer people are interested in coming to church. It is a complicated story with many factors involved.
